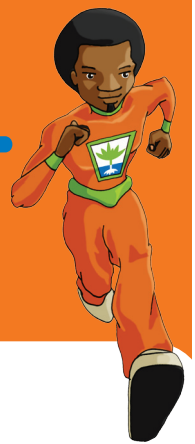

- In New York, the Global Ambassadors student club from Bronxville Middle School organized a school-wide Global Awareness Day in addition to a dodgeball tournament to benefit Action Against Hunger.
- Ridge Academy in Chicago, IL extended the educational component of the campaign with student research projects

focusing on countries where Action Against Hunger works. After presenting to fellow classmates, students shared a meal of traditional foods from each country.
